Hi everyone,

Well it's 2022 and we are still coping with the effects of this Covid-19 pandemic. Confusion and poor communication doesn't help does it?

I remember when nursing, we had to write down concise records of everything we did for our patients. We also had to hand over at the end of our shift, and give detailed reports. On night duty at about 2:00 AM the night Superintendent would stealthily do a round. As nurse in charge, (a third year student nurse), we had to know every patient's name what their diagnosis was, and how many days post op if on a surgical ward. We would have a little notepad in our pocket so that we didn't fall for foul of sister's wrath. She often caught us unawares, and we often walked round with her without our shoes, or without our hat on, she always notice of course.



I went to Romania in 1992 with a team from Doncaster to help the situation in the country's orphanages, a legacy from Ceausescu's rule. We gave lots of practical help for one orphanage in particular, and on a second visit we were part of a conference held and attended by the government, including health secretaries, mayors from towns, doctors, and charitable organisations. I was asked to give a talk about running a hospital as I was matron at the time.



I also had to talk about primary healthcare. I was terrified! I had an interpreter who was rubbish and misinterpreted a lot of what I said. I only found out later when a UNICEF Rep told me, I'd rather he hadn't, but it did explain some of the strange looks I received!



So communication is so very important, passing on information and asking for help keeps the wheels turning; or in our organisation, it keeps us going.

Hymns are so often prayers, so sing this one if you know it:

Seek ye first the Kingdom of God
and his righteousness
and all these things shall be added unto you
allelu alleluia!

Verse three tells us to 'ask and shall be given unto you seek and you shall find'.
