AFFIA stands for Away from It All and is an initiative run by the Diocese of Sheffield Mothers' Union to provide holidays for families in need of a break. This may be because of bereavement or illness i.e. a long term condition or some tragedy which has caused trauma in a family. The holidays are at a holiday park on the East Coast and cost about £1000 for each family. This includes travel to the holiday park and each family are given a substantial food hamper. Branches are asked to support AFFIA and this year, the proceeds of our Summer Tea Party will be for this cause.
