Helen Curtis writes:

Many of you will have seen a jar, a bit like a sweet jar, in church with coins in it. These are Elaine's Pennies, to which so many people have contributed. At the moment the jar is refilling, having been emptied and counted 2 weeks ago. We were all staggered to find that £101 was in the jar and our thanks go to everyone who has contributed.

The money has been given to The Doncaster Women's Refuge for the benefit of the residents. It has so far bought outdoor play equipment for the refuge garden and I am told that the children have loved it. After traumatic events bringing them and the mothers to the refuge it is good to know that there is somewhere for the children to play safely. We bought irons and clothes airers for each of the units at the refuge and more recently have provided kettles and toasters for the woman to take with them when they move into independent accommodation. Since fuel has increased in cost we looked at what could be provided to help to save costs and have bought slow cookers. Last week at the deanery meeting Tanis told us that the refuge were absolutely delighted with these and more will be very welcome, so this is what we will be buying next.

Warm and Welcoming Heating Initiative

The Warm and Welcoming initiative seeks to raise £100,000 to upgrade the church's heating system as the necessary first part of our vision for a re-ordered church, fit for collective and private worship and a community resource. Up and coming fundraising events are:
