Margaret Jones's funeral takes place in St Mary's at 11.00 am on Friday next, 27th January. Margaret worshipped at St Mary's for over fifty years, until she moved last year to be nearer her family. She served on the PCC for much of this time and has the distinction of being the first-ever female churchwarden in the long history of St Mary's church. She was a governor of St Mary's school for many years and served on both the Diocesan and Deanery Synod. Above all she was a wise, faithful and caring member of our church community.
