#### Fabric Team

The cost of a new dishwasher will be in the order of  $\mathfrak{L}500$  with plumbing work to fit at approximately  $\mathfrak{L}100$ , the PCC formally agreed to the purchase. In the event the cost increases before purchase the PCC have agreed for this to be dealt with by the Standing Committee. The cost of a small tabletop fridge was agreed at a maximum cost of  $\mathfrak{L}100$ .

The earlier agreed concept of pursuing the change of use of St. Luke's chapel to a meeting room was discussed in some detail. It was eventually decided that this concept be stopped for the time being, for possible consideration at a future date, should any possible reordering programme offer this opportunity. No timeline was suggested.

Relocation of the archive can still be accommodated in St. Lukes's depending on the volume of paper and requiring cabinets.

#### **Finance**

The reports were received with thanks. Whilst the recent appeal was expecting to increase regular giving in the order of 20%, the outcome was significantly less than this; the complete financial position to be reported at the next PCC meeting.

The discussion then led into the pledge for the 2026 Common Fund contribution. The financial reports accurately showing the current financial status and the disappointing outcome of the appeal, it was agreed that the 2026 contribution should remain unchanged at £45,000, with a review to take place later in the year, if income was exceeding expectations.
